9. Water Report		Jan seminar put on by Wildsight report – very informative. Recreational impact on water. First Nations speaker, Living Lakes speaker, introduced Columbia Basin Water Hub (which WLLID regularly submits info to), 2010 foreshore study done – Wasa could be a candidate for doing it by drone, whirling disease in fish covered, Rocky Mtn Conservation officer spoke on invasive mussels. Question/answer session in afternoon as well as boat cleaning demonstration. Columbia Wetland Stewardship Partners speaker, Lake Windermere Ambassadors speaker BCLSS – Lake Keepers program, Jan will follow up Shauna – LAC (Larratt Aquatic Consulting) sediment proposal. Mini version of Windermere study, they will come in May to train trustees on collection, etc. ½ cost of Windermere study. \$11,000 plus accommodation (May 10-11?, 31-1?, 24-25?) Shauna will check with them for available dates, number of hours training will require. Nowell would like to do volunteer training on same weekend to pkg events together. (Adam, Alex, Dirk volunteers) Walk to gauges and flap gates – same time? Shauna moved for WLLID to approve funding for Larratt Aquatic Consulting to undertake sediment quality assessment at Wasa from May to September and provide us with a report. Luke seconded, all in favour, carried. Penny asked what the purpose behind testing sediment was. If churned up it impacts bacteria

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		growth and releases toxins into the water. Leads to algae blooms, etc. BC Parks Campers Beach – request made, await LOA (letter of authority) BCLSS – no kids stuff, but maybe some swag Living Lakes will participate with booth/info – maybe some swag as well BC Parks swag? Nowell met with Kathy McCauley to get an idea of cost and procedures for bbq. Get smokies / hotdogs from Gwinners, buns/condiments/cake from Save on, water/pop, etc. Do up a letter of request with letterhead for Save on to get a discount / donation. 11:30 – 3 for public (maybe 50 people) VAST – aerial no go, new regulations state drones must include a parachute. Vast does not have this and it increases the cost. Does Laratt have a parachute enabled drone? Can we get one? Nowell will follow up on parachute enabled drones available through other organizations. WLLID booth at pancake breakfast – need commitments for long weekends in July (June 28), August, September. lake bottom clean-up – pending Nowell has been out to the river to inspect gauges, etc. Everything is good so far. Needs a bit of maintenance.
